New discoveries in the field of Chemistry

1. Scientists have developed an innovative catalyst that achieves a significantly lower carbon footprint, paving the way for greener chemical and pharmaceutical manufacturing.
2. Research reveals that recycling post-use plastic through pyrolysis can reduce GHG emissions by (18-23)%. The approach can potentially enhance sustainability by minimizing waste and fossil resources.
3. Electron beam radiation can repair nanostructures.
4. Two-dimensional compounds can capture carbon from the air.
5. Metal-blowing microbes could replace the chemical processing of rare earths.
6. A new CRISPR – based gene-editing tool has been developed which could lead to better treatments for patients with genetic disorders.

Do plants grow listening to music?

Playing music for your plants may seem like a strange thing to do. Believe it or not, numerous studies have indicated that playing music for plants really boosts plant growth. Vibrations from sound waves seem to stimulate growth factors.



Research has shown that music has the ability to stimulate plant growth.

An Indian botanist conducted several experiments on music and plant growth. He found that certain plants grew an extra 20 percent in height when exposed to music, with a considerably greater growth in biomass. He found similar results for agricultural crops, such as peanuts, rice, and tobacco, when he played music through loudspeakers placed around the field.

A Colorado greenhouse owner experimented with several types of plants and various genres of music. She determined that plants "listening" to rock music deteriorated quickly and died within a couple of weeks, while plants thrived when exposed to classical music.

A researcher in Illinois engaged in a few highly controlled greenhouse experiments. Surprisingly, he found that soy and corn plants exposed to music were thicker and greener with significantly larger yields.

Researchers at a Canadian university discovered that harvest yields of wheat crops nearly doubled when exposed to high-frequency vibrations.

Plants that were exposed to sounds showed more growth than plants in a soundless control group.

The exact cause of music's effect on plants is unclear. It is thought that plants may have "mechanoreceptors" that respond to pressure.

Sound is transmitted in the form of waves that travel through a medium, such as air or water. The waves cause the particles in this medium to vibrate.

In a similar manner, the pressure from sound waves creates vibrations that could be picked up by plants. Plants would not "hear" the music; they would feel the vibrations of the sound wave.

The vibrations picked up by the plant might speed up the protoplasmic movement in the cells. This stimulation then could affect the system and improve performance, such as the manufacture of nutrients that develop a stronger and better plant.

Plants do not have eyes or ears, but they are still able to sense things. They lack a nervous system, but they have their own type of intelligence. They enjoy the energy some music produces and grows.

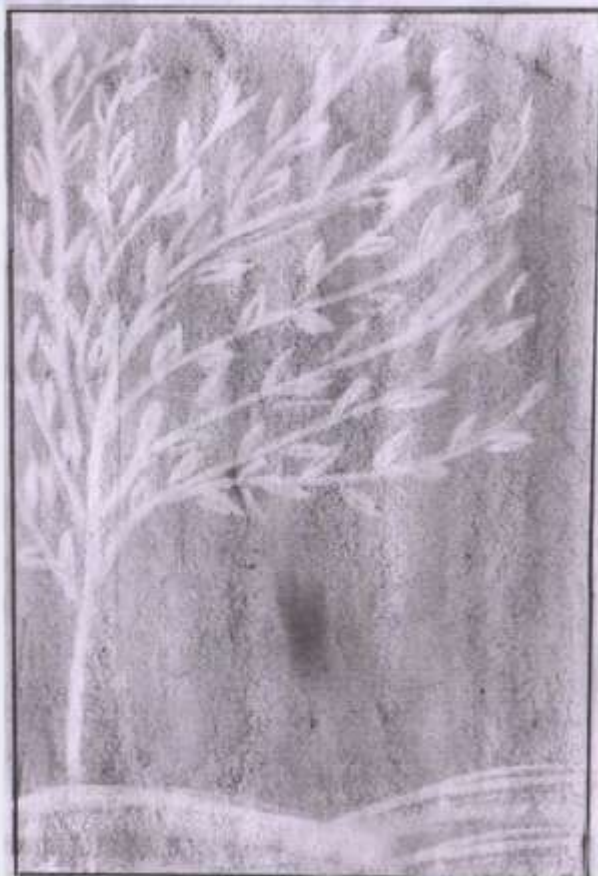

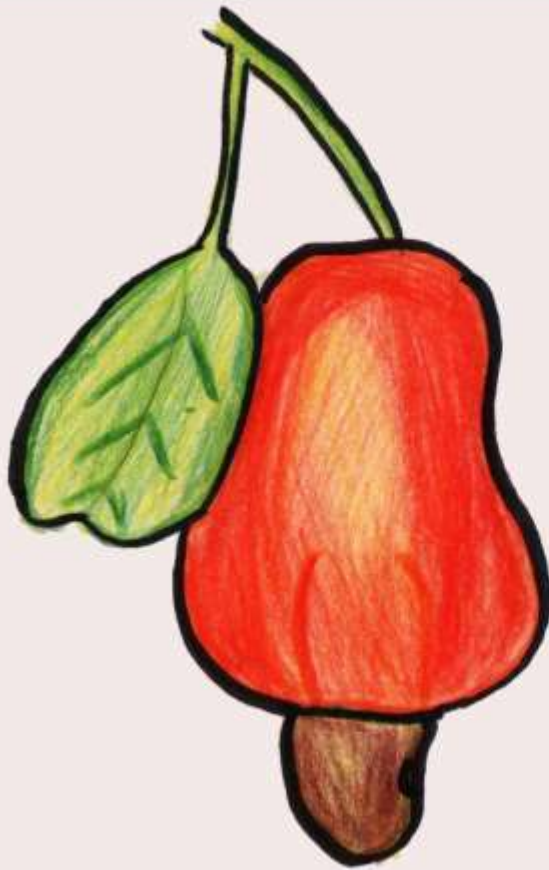

Biologists believe that the Earth is now heading towards 6th mass extinction, while previous extinctions have been driven by natural planetary transformation or catastrophic asteroid strikes, the current die-off appears to be associated with human activity; a situation designated as an era of 'Anthropocene defaunation'. Across vertebrates, 16 to 33 percent of all species are estimated to be globally threatened or endangered. The situation is similarly dire for invertebrate animal life. Large animals – described as megafauna and including elephants, rhinoceroses, Polar bears, and countless other species worldwide face the highest rate of decline, a trend that matches previous extinction events.
