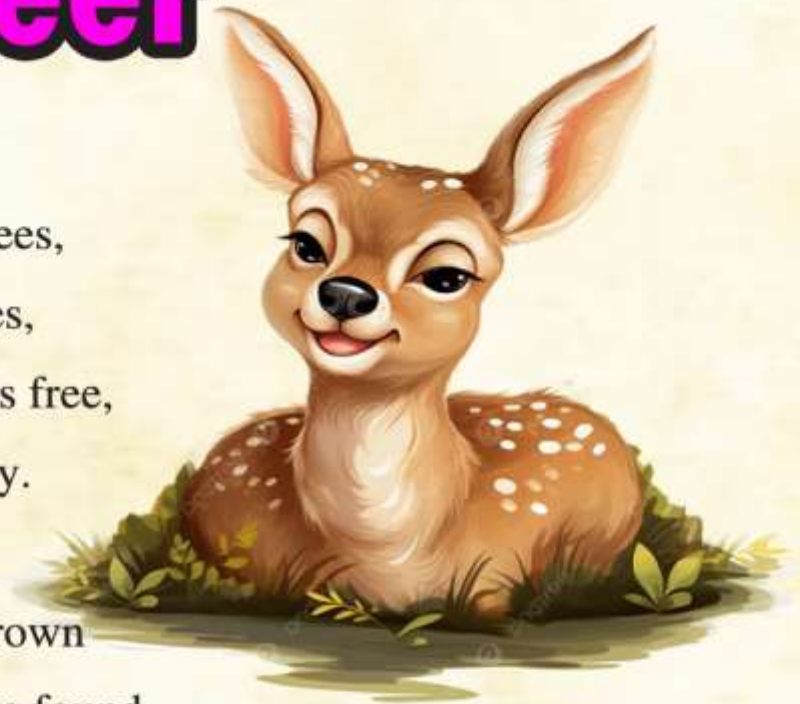

A reminder of our place, in this wondrous land.

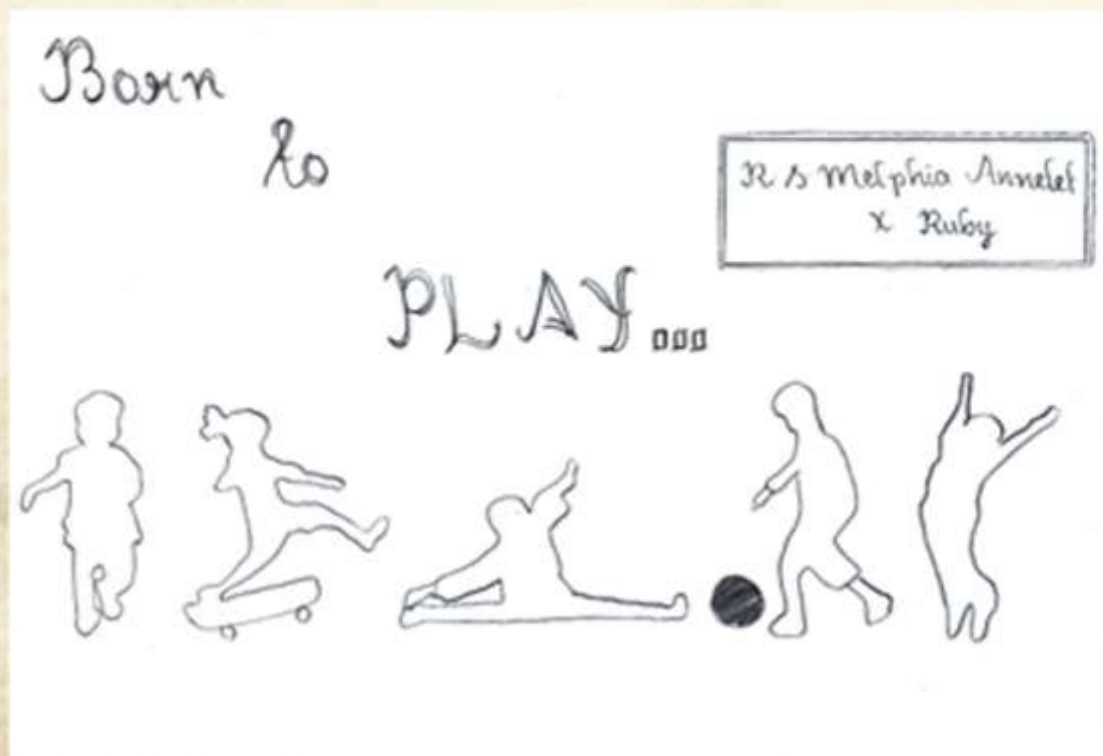
So let us listen, to this beat so true,

It is the privilege of God.

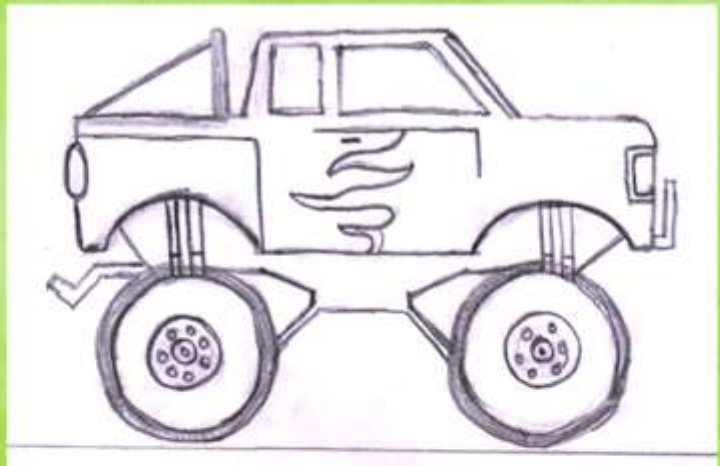
