The commencement of the Phanerozoic era (about 540 million years ago) marked a rapid growth in biodiversity via the Cambrian Explosion. During this period, the majority of multicellular phyla first appeared. Since then, all sorts of living organisms have covered the Earth, with the tropics constituting about 50% of the world's species.

Biodiversity is essential for the survival of life on Earth, as it makes ecosystems resilient to natural disasters and climate change. It also contributes to pollination, soil fertility, and oxygen production.

Biodiversity is currently in danger due to human activities, with a significant loss in genetic diversity in particular. This is referred to as the Holocene extinction. In order to preserve global biodiversity, scientists have taken measures such as establishing gene banks and creating wildlife corridors. Forest reserves and biosphere reserves have been set up all over the world with the aim of protecting plants and animals from extinction, thus providing a chance for Earth to thrive with diverse life forms.

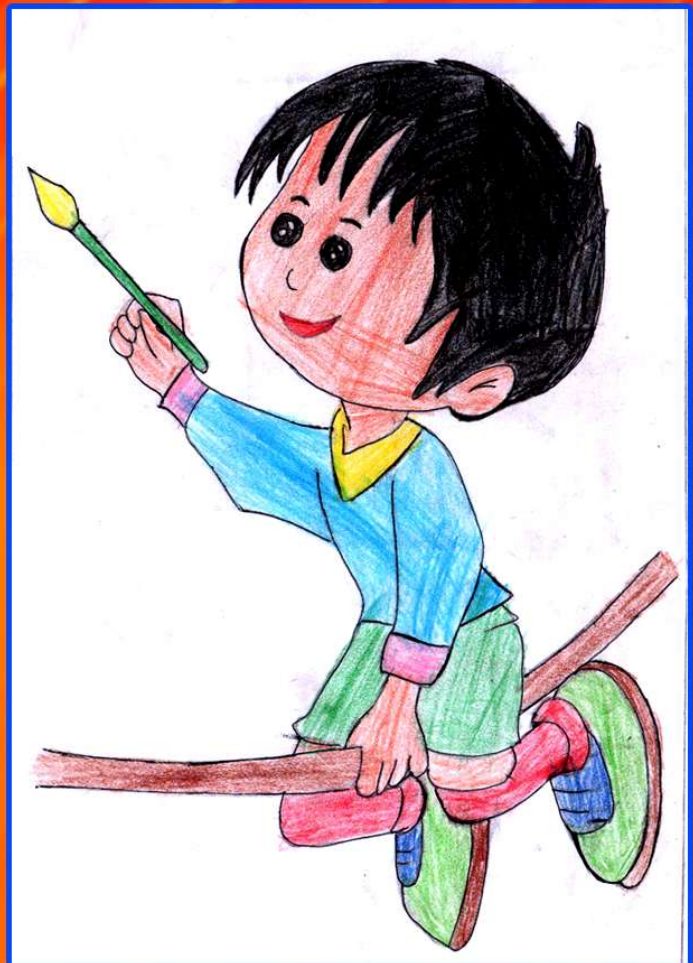
The Elephant and Friends

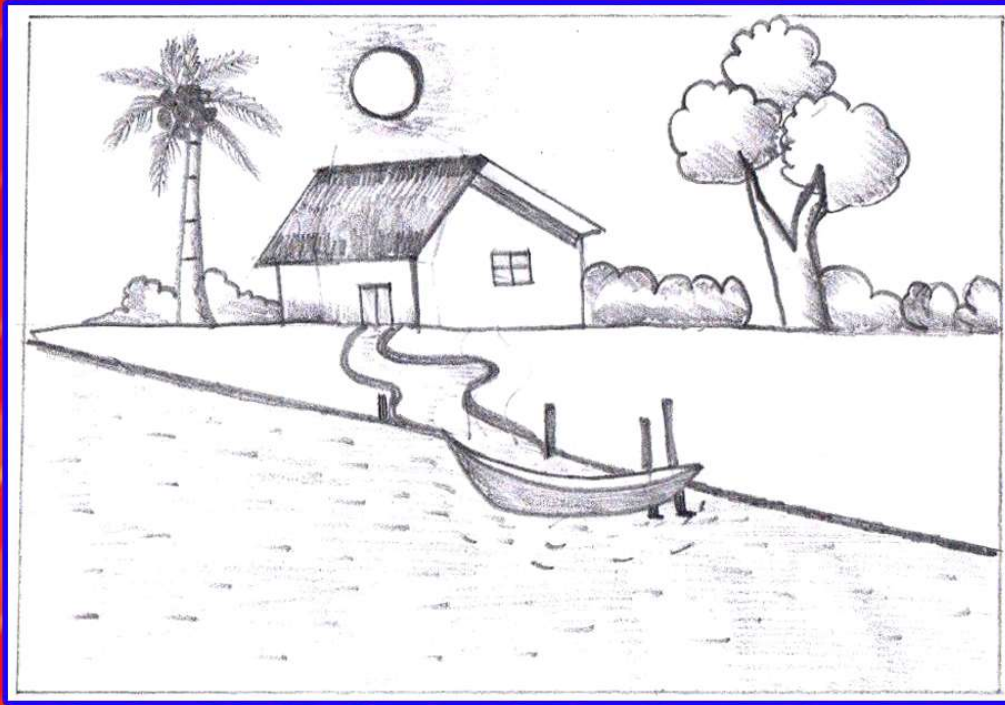

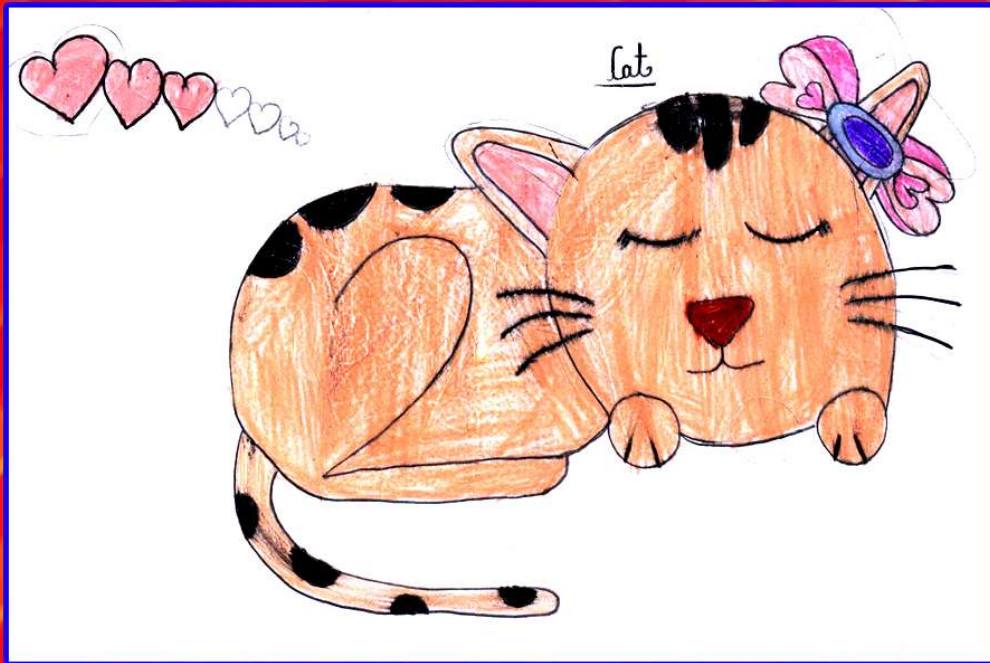
